**Sermon Title: *One For All***

**Text: Ephesians 4:4-7**

**Big Idea:** God's plan for the unity of His people is that we all focus more on what we have in common through Christ than focusing on our differences.

**Treating "spiritual nearsightedness" by looking out into our Christian oneness:**

- 1) There is only one body or **spiritual family**. (Ephesians 4:4)
- 2) There is only one Spirit or **divine nature**. (Ephesians 4:4 / Romans 8:11)
- 3) There is only one hope or **confident future**. (Ephesians 4:4 / Revelation 4:8 / Titus 2:11-14)
- 4) There is only one Lord or **priority**. (Ephesians 4:5)
- 5) There is only one faith or **saving truth**. (Ephesians 4:5 / 1 Corinthians 3:11)
- 6) There is only one baptism or **identification**. (Ephesians 4:5)
- 7) There is only one God and Father of all or **Heavenly Father**. (Ephesians 4:6 & 4:7)

Common **goals** in a church are unimpressive without sacrificial **cooperation** with one another.

**Personal Application – Study Questions:**

Using the seven oneness principles of Ephesians 4:4-7, how can you practice unified, spiritual "far-sightedness?"

- 1) Do something for another believer that costs you something.
- 2) Prayerfully submit to God's presence when praying or serving Him.
- 3) Praise God for His holiness each day this week.
- 4) Remove one obvious idol from your life each day this week.
- 5) Declare Christ to one person this week as the only way.
- 6) Remember your baptism, or consider getting baptized if you are not.
- 7) Thank God for a uniqueness in another believer's life.
