Title:
“Care Continually for One Another”

Text: 1 Corinthians 12:14-26

Big Idea: A healthy church is a rich variety of believers who have in common, not just a place or a purpose, but the living presence of our Lord Jesus and continual care for each other.

What does it mean to be constantly caring for one another?

- 1) Constantly caring means each believer **counts**. (2 Corinthians 12:12-14)
- 2) Constantly caring means each believer is **indispensable**. (2 Corinthians 12:15-17)
- 3) Constantly caring means each believer is **sovereignly arranged**. (2 Corinthians 12:18)
- 4) Constantly caring means each believer is **interconnected**. (2 Corinthians 12:21-22)
- 5) Constantly caring means God has **shaped us** to care for each other. (2 Corinthians 12:24-25)

Each believer intensifies the light of God’s truth by remaining **plugged in** to the Body of Christ.

Study/Application Questions and Actions:

- 1) If you could improve one thing about your physical body, what would that be and which other key parts of your body would have to pitch in to make that happen?
- 2) What is the difference between a church being merely organized and a church that is alive in Christ and with each other? Which is most effective and why?
- 3) In what specific ways could you help another believer who is feeling inferior to others in the church understand their true value to God’s eternal kingdom?
- 4) What specific actions could I practice this month that keeps me from being “potato-headed” and makes me more “care-bearish?”
- 5) Ask yourself how you could increasingly value your specific connectedness and contribution to helping our church become the “light of the world.”
